# Country Guide: Netherlands

## **Used Household Goods and Personal Effects**

#### Documents Required

#### 1. Copy of passport

- 2. Detailed inventory
- 3. Bewijs van aanmelding
- 4. Aangifte Douane 39 form (diplomats)
- 5. Copy of the registration at town/city hall where the shipper will live (document must mention the country the shipper is moving from).
- 6. When client does not have his town/city hall registration yet, client may also submit a proof of deregistration from the country of origin. Please also supply one of the following documents:
  - a. Copy of a work contract or declaration from the employer confirming the period of working for them abroad and will now be working for them in the Netherlands as from ...... (date),
- 7. OR
  - a. Copy of a rental agreement or purchase contract of the residence in the Netherlands. This may not be older than 6 months.

#### Specific Information

- 1. The "Bewijs van aanmelding" is the certificate from the population register of the municipality showing owner of the goods' intent to reside in the Netherlands
- 2. The Netherlands application is a required form that must be filled out to be able to move to the Netherlands
- 3. All fumigated containers arriving in the port of Rotterdam or Antwerp with an excessive concentration of gas will be removed from the logistic transport chain.
- 4. Delays may take several months before the container is released.
- 5. High costs may be incurred due to any delays.
- 6. The following conditions must apply for the duty-free import of the household effects shipment:
- 7. The permanent residence of the owner of the goods must be the Netherlands or another European Union member country.
- 8. The previous permanent residence of the owner of the goods situated outside of the European Union for at least 12 months.
- 9. All goods have been used as part of the normal household of the owner of the goods and will be used for the same purpose.
- 10. All goods have been in the owner of the goods' possession for at least 6 months and have been used during that time.
- 11. The goods will be imported into the Netherlands within 12 months after registration.
- 12. The goods will not be sold, rented off or given away within 12 months after registration in the Netherlands.
- 13. Owners of the goods must apply to Customs for the exemption in the import declaration.
- 14. The following documents are required:
- 15. A signed inventory listing all of the personal goods in the shipment.
- 16. The certificate of registration in the personal records database of the municipality in the Netherlands.
- 17. Must certify that the date on which the owner of the goods has established in the Netherlands or another country within the European Union.
- 18. Owner of the goods can also send comparable documentary evidence demonstrating that this is the case.
  - a) Employment contract
  - b) Employer statement
  - c) Work permit
  - d) Rental contract or mortgage certificate for new place of residence
- 19. All containers arriving in the Port of Rotterdam with an excessive concentration of gas will be taken out from the logistic transport chain. (Methyl bromide is mostly used toxic gas).
- 20. According to the Ministry one may expect delays running up to several months before a fumigated container finally will be released to the consignee. Obviously high costs will be involved if a container has an excessive concentration of gas.

## **Motor Vehicles**

#### Documents Required

- 1. Certificate of title / registration
- 2. Purchase invoice or other proof of ownership
- 3. Original bill of lading
- 4. Certificate of residence
- 5. Copy of foreign insurance certificate or proof of insurance

#### Specific Information

- 1. Consideration for an application for free entry of motor vehicles is 4 to 6 weeks
- 2. A separate application for any tax exemption must be completed if not imported with the household effects shipment.
- 3. A technical inspection as well as registration is required at the RDW after Customs clearance.

## Pets

Documents Required

- 1. Vaccination record
- 2. Veterinary health certificate

#### Specific Information

- 1. The veterinary health certificate must be signed by an authorized veterinarian within 8 days of import.
- 2. The vaccination record must be signed at least 31 days prior to departure but not longer than 12 months prior to import.

## Wedding Trousseau / Gifts

- 1. Inventory in 2 copies.
- 2. Marriage certificate.
- 3. Certificate of residence.
- 4. Exemption of duties form.

### **Restricted/Dutiable Items**

- 1. Hunting and shooting firearms require a permit issued by the Dutch authorities
- 2. Medicines:
  - a) To import medicines, a manufacturing license issued by the Ministry of Health, Welfare and Sport is required.
  - b) Medications must be for personal use.
  - c) Owners of the goods should request a medical passport from a general practitioner to verify the personal use of the medication.
- 3. Plants / flowers / fruits / vegetables:
  - a) These items require a phytosanitary certificate from the country of origin declaring the items healthy and free from diseases.
  - b) If a phytosanitary certificate is unavailable, Customs will confiscate the items.
- 4. Animal Products / Food Items:
  - a) A health certificate is required for the import of these items, including but not limited to, cheese, milk, eggs, meat, meat products, animal skins, and hunting trophies.
  - b) The health certificate must be issued by the authorities of the origin country at the time the goods are imported.
  - c) All animal products and food items are subject to veterinary examination upon arrival.
  - d) Goods of animal origin, including food items, are subject to special requirements.
    - i) Contact the destination for specific information and exceptions.
  - e) Powdered milk, baby food, and special food items for medical purposed may be imported provided the following requirements are met:
    - i) The products do not need to be chilled prior to consumption.

- ii) The products are packaged products of a registered trademark.
- iii) The packaging should be unopened and undamaged.
- f) An exemption from the required health certificate applies to products in which an animal ingredient is no longer identifiable (e.g., chocolate, etc.).
- g) Contact the Dutch Embassy in the origin country if you need assistance.

## **Prohibited Items**

- 1. Weapons (toy and imitation) and ammunition (strike, thrust or stabbing weapons; gas pistols, alarm pistols, pepper sprays, etc.)
- 2. Alcohol / Cigarettes / Tobacco
